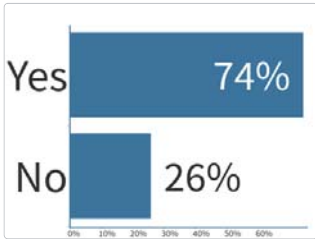

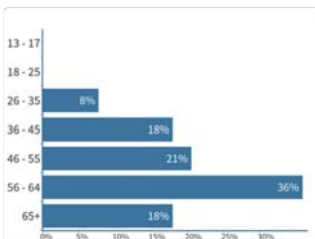

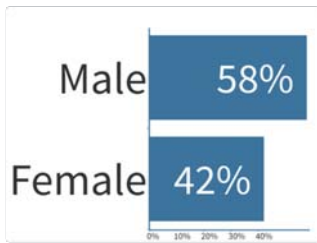

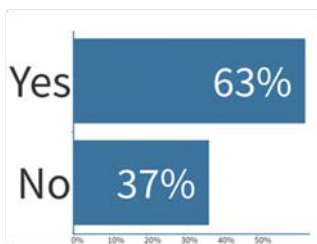

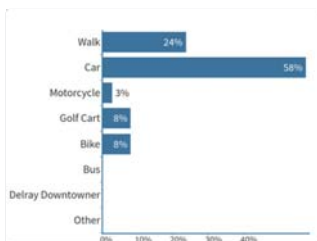

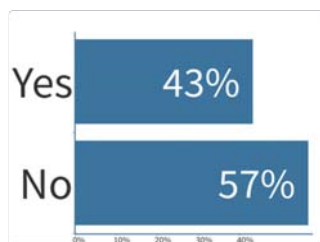

### Do you find it difficult to find parking when attending an event at OSS?

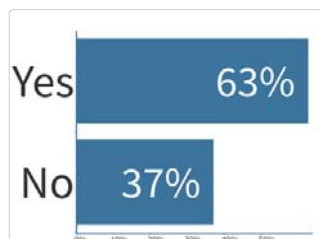

### Are there sufficient means of public transportation to OSS?

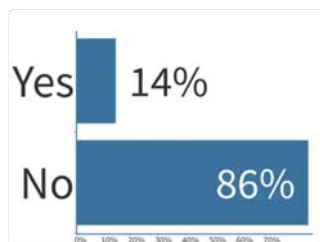

### Are handicap accessible routes and drop offs a current problem for you?

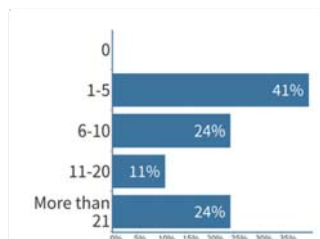

### What are the number of times you have attended events at OSS in the past year?

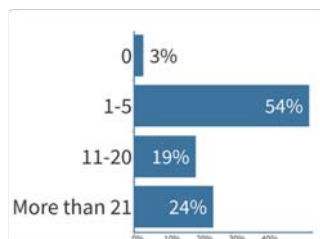

### How many times have you come to OSS not for a specific event in the past year?

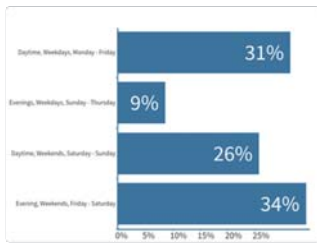

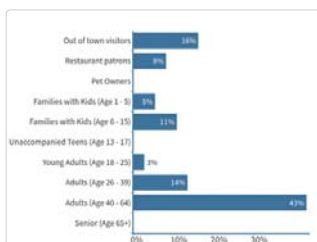

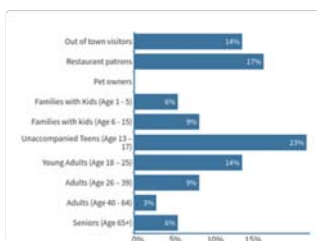

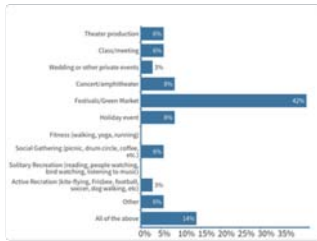

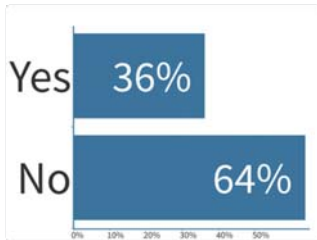

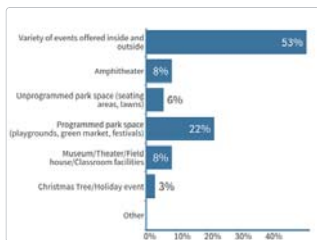

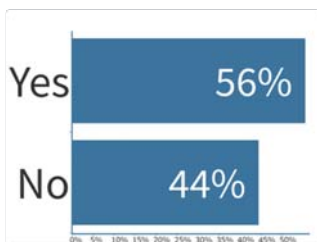

### Do you feel that OSS, through it's current operations, supports your vision for the City and OSS?

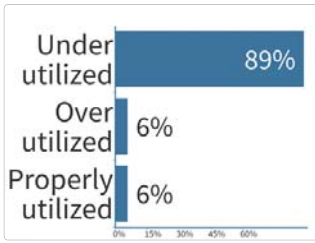

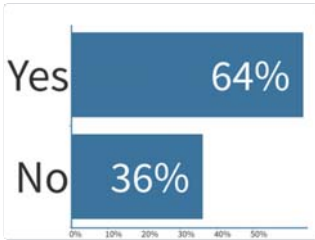

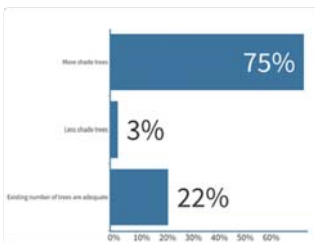

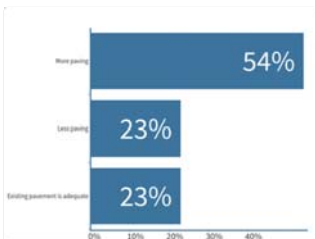

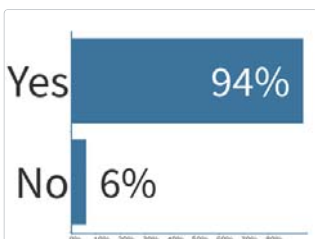

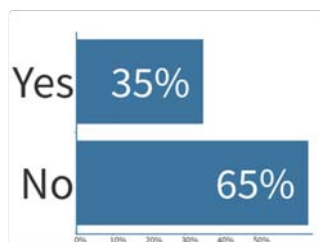

### Does OSS celebrate/announce one's arrival at the town's center?

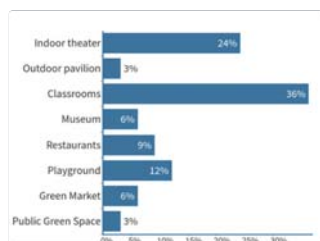

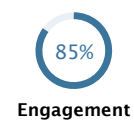

### While walking around OSS, which of the following was most difficult to find or you are surprised to learn exists?

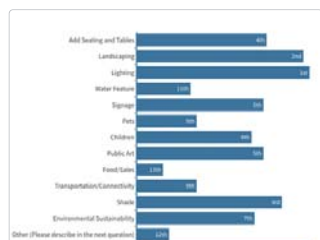

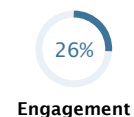

There should be a smaller stage, kind of like the one they have across from the fire station at the corner of SW 4th ave and W Atlantic. I think the concession/bathroom building has to come down, as well as the canopy walkway from the Crest to Cornell. Those two items mess up the flow of pedestrian traffic.

Visual and pedestrian connectivity

Do not move the tree

Need permanent fencing or similar enclosure in order to eliminate temporary fencing used for events which stays up for days/weeks at a time.

I would to remember to included a safe and clean place for our youth and families to enjoy.

Improving the site would be beneficial. However I would encourage you to NOT relocate the Christmas tree. The Tree is a seasonal landmark visible as you approach down town. I would also hazard a guess that the structure has a considerable support structure beneath the ground that will need to be relocated at no small expense. In addition the green market is an anchor event every Saturday morning. Relocating the Tree would seriously disrupt the GM from Mid November to mid January.
