JUNE 2017 UPDATE

The CRA approved FY 16-17 funding of \$2,512,905 for the City's FY 16-17 Clean and Safe Program. The funding includes:

SIGNIFICANT ARRESTS / INCIDENTS

- **17-9105 Simple Battery 777 E Atlantic Avenue:** Vagrant Douglas Woods was arrested after punching the manager of Ocean, who had politely asked him to stop sleeping at an outdoor table of his restaurant. This took place on the 8th and Woods hasn't returned to the City at the time of this writing.
- **17-10197 Grand Theft Auto/Grand Theft/Narcotics Arrest 910 W Atlantic:** Victim was awakened by police and fire personnel who had responded to his hotel room after a female reported he was overdosing. He was uncooperative and claimed he had been drugged. He also reported that the female had taken his Audi, iPad, wallet, cell phone, watch and a pizza they ordered from Domino's. Video showed defendant Jean Stevens loading his property into the Audi with an unknown black male. Officer Brotz located Jean driving the victim's vehicle with his property and a sizeable amount of crack cocaine and heroin. She claimed that he said he would pay her a thousand dollars to take everything because he was overdosing and didn't want his future ex-wife's lawyers learning about it. This didn't make a lot of sense and she was arrested for the listed charges and a warrant from South Carolina.
- **17-10130 Business Burglary 540 W. Atlantic Avenue (Bear's):** Video showed an older white male enter the unlocked business and steal 200 dollars from the cash register. Officers identified the suspect as Michael Lauzier. Officers Lehe, Liberta and Sergeant Baer responded to Lauzier's address where he refused to speak with officers. His parents later identified his photo from the video and probable cause was developed. He was arrested the next day by road patrol.

PROBLEM AREAS / CITIZEN COMPLAINTS / VAGRANTS / TRANSIENTS

- **Veteran's Park:** This park remains an area of concentrated vagrant activity due to its shady areas, frequent entertainment, public restrooms, proximity to package liquor stores and the East Atlantic Avenue corridor. Officers continue to monitor this activity. Extra Patrols: 64, Walk and Talks: 51, Arrests: 4.
- **Old School Square:** Since the restroom hours were changed, the loitering and less desirable activity as nearly ceased. Extra Patrols: 48, Walk and Talks: 17.

- **Libby Wesley Park:** Since Old School Square was improved, this park has seen the highest concentration of mal users/vagrant activity in the Clean and Safe area. It is believed this is due to its proximity to the Caring Kitchen, multiple package liquor stores and available power outlets. It continues to be patrolled by officers. Extra Patrols: 37 , Walk and Talks:17, Arrests: 2.
- **Vacant Funeral Home (CRA property) 606 W. Atlantic Avenue:** Officers continue to monitor this location which has seen a decrease in vagrant/mal user activity. Extra Patrols: 30
- **Gateway to Downtown by I95:** Complaints of camping at this location decrease this month, vegetation was cut back as well. .
- **Vagrants:** Delray Yacht Cruises staff had concerns about W/M Stevie Bunn, who is out of jail after serving time for vandalizing their charter yachts. Bunn has been hanging around Veteran's Park. Officer Brotz had conversations with Bunn on multiple occasions. Bunn maintains that he will not go near the yachts or cause the business trouble. Sergeant DeBree conducted an operation at I-95 + W. Atlantic regarding panhandling. Four offenders were arrested, including an active known offender, Eric Huey.
- **Traffic:** Officer Parzyck conducted selective enforcement on E. Atlantic regarding trucks on the Avenue and in the 1200 block of W. Atlantic due to the previous year's traffic study labeling it a problem location.
- **Parking Enforcement:** CSO McBrinn issued 105 parking UTC's this month.

- Officer Guillaume attended SWAT training this month.
- CSO McBrinn attended classes regarding the use of the City's new finance software as she is a back up to PD personnel in that section.
- Squad officers qualified with their on and off duty firearms this month.
- Officer Jaworski attended the Underwater Criminal Investigations Class (32 hours)
- Two DBPD interns spent 36 hours of "ride-along" time in units this month
