**CITY OF DELRAY BEACH – CLEAN AND SAFE PROGRAM**  
**JULY 2017 UPDATE**

The CRA approved FY 16-17 funding of \$2,512,905 for the City's FY 16-17 Clean and Safe Program. The funding includes:

Police/Safe section

- 1 Sergeant
- 10 Police officers
- 1 Community Service Officer

Clean section

- 1 Downtown Manager
- 2 Code Enforcement Officers
- 3 Maintenance Workers (1 Supervisor & 2 General)
- 2 General Landscape/ Litter Maintenance Workers
- 1.625 Electricians
- Parking Garage Maintenance Staff- portion of salary
- Park Maintenance Staff- portion of salary
- 1 Sanitation Officer

Funding is also included for the following:

- Trash can liners
- Pressure cleaning
- Street sweeping
- Gardening and other supplies
- Decorative lighting maintenance
- Electricity for decorative street lights
- Street lighting bucket truck expense
- Libby Wesley Plaza Maintenance

**SIGNIFICANT ARRESTS / INCIDENTS**

- **17-11188 Grand Theft/Heroin Possession/Resisting W/O Violence 207 E Atlantic:** Robert Wojcicki stole a \$350 dollar pair of sunglasses from Sunglass Hut and walked eastbound on Atlantic where he was spotted by Officer Liberta. A foot chase ensued and he was caught by Officers Liberta and Jaworski behind the Pinball Museum. The sunglasses were recovered along with a packet of heroin.
- **17-01152 Possession of Heroin w/ Intent to Sell and Possession of a Controlled Substance w/o a Prescription Arres 2 SW 5<sup>th</sup> Ave:** Timmie Lee Ivey was arrested at 725 W Atlantic Ave as a result of a narcotics operation at Libby Wesley Park. POP and Clean and Safe officers worked together to execute this arrest and to eliminate a drug dealer in the park. (Schumer)

**PROBLEM AREAS / CITIZEN COMPLAINTS / VAGRANTS / TRANSIENTS**

- **Veteran's Park:** This park remains an area of concentrated vagrant activity due to its shady areas, frequent entertainment, public restrooms, and proximity to package liquor stores and E. Atlantic Avenue. Surprisingly, calls for service went down slightly this month, despite new vagrant W/M John Koenig, who caused multiple issues there. Koenig has difficulty getting along with others and has generated numerous calls for service regarding this and overdosing on drugs. Unit officers continue to patrol this park and night time patrol officers were requested to increase their foot patrols as well to eject overnight users. Extra Patrols: 95, Walk and Talks: 52, Arrests: 2.
- **Old School Square:** Since the restroom hours were changed, this park continues to be in a maintenance phase. Extra Patrols: 40, Walk and Talks: 14.
- **Libby Wesley Park:** This park has seen the highest concentration of mal users/vagrant activity in the Clean and Safe area since the improvements made to Old School Square. It is believed this is due to its proximity to the Caring Kitchen, multiple package liquor stores and its available power outlets. It continues to be patrolled by officers. In addition, the Clean and Safe officers have recently begun working with IMPACT officers to address the narcotics issues. Extra Patrols: 67, Walk and Talks: 29, Arrests: 3.

- **Vagrants:** As noted above, W/M John Koenig recently became homeless and has generated calls regarding being beaten up by other vagrants, suspected overdoses on drugs, or randomly screaming obscenities at people in the park.
- **Traffic:** Officer Parzyck conducted selective enforcement in the 1200 block of W. Atlantic due to the previous year's traffic study labeling it a problem location.
- **Parking Enforcement:** CSO McBrinn issued 40 parking UTC's this month.

#### **TRAINING / SPECIAL ASSIGNMENTS**

- Squad officers were trained in Protective Element Medical Operations. This entails escorting DBFD medics into active shooter locations to triage, treat and evacuate wounded citizens.
- Officer Guillaume attended SWAT training.
- Officer Guillaume attended a two day SWAT Breaching School in Homestead.
- Officer McInerney attended the Delray Beach Homeless Initiative meeting on 7/6/17

#### **COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT**

- Officer Schumer and Jaworski passed out the Homeless Coalition Flyers to the known vagrants throughout the downtown area. This initiative was held at St Mary's Episcopal Church. This event is organized by the Homeless Coalition provided valuable information and resources for our homeless population.
- Officer Parzyck attended Velocity Martial Arts Camp and addressed approximately 30-40 elementary school aged children about our profession.
- Officer Brotz worked with the DBPD Explorers to both prepare them for boot camp and then as a DT instructor at the boot camp.
- Officer Guillaume helped prepare for the Department's National Night Out event.
- Officer Guillaume handed out fliers for the Homeless Outreach Program then drove four homeless subjects to it.
- Officer Guillaume attended the quarter auction event for assistance to Officer B Marc.

#### **BUSINESS / COMMUNITY MEETINGS/OTHER**

- Sergeant Baer attended the DDA meeting on the 10<sup>th</sup>.
- Officer Liberta conducted and completed a CPTED Site Plan Survey of 404 W Atlantic Ave.
- Officer Guillaume received a SPIRIT award after a fellow officer spotted him remove his shoes and a t shirt from his trunk and give them to a homeless man.
- CSO McBrinn assisted with the City's new payroll system this month.
